M/s Dalmia Cement Bharat Limited (DCBL) has been granted Badarkha Limestone Block from the Government of Madhya Pradesh through the auction process. The Environmental Clearance for the project has been attained on date 10.09.2025 from SEIAA Bhopal and subsequently the Badarkha Limestone Mining Lease over an area of 121.10 Ha. was duly executed and registered on 15.09.2025.

While processing for the environment clearance, as an essential document, an EKAL Pramanpatra was obtained from the Amarpatan Tehsil for Badarkha Limestone Block area. From that document (EKAL Pramanpatra) It has come to our notice that, "Bahuti Nahar Bela" is proposed through the Bigoudi, Badarkha and Sannehi-Sigti area of Badarkha Limestone (Auction) Block.

In this context, we have previously reached out through our letters dated 27.05.2024 and 28.01.2025 addressed to the Principal Secretary, Mineral Resource Department, Bhopal with a copy marked to The Executive Engineer, Bansagar Project, Satna requesting to divert the proposed canal construction in the Badarkha Limestone Mining Lease area. Against our application, the respected PS, MRD Bhopal issued several communications (enclosed copies of MRD Letters) addressed to your good office for resolution of the issue by examining the possibility of diversion of the proposed canal away from the Badarkha Limestone Mining Lease area.

The Badarkha Limestone Block was notified by the Government of Madhya Pradesh for auction in four blocks excluding nala and road. There was no mention in the tender document of "Bahuti Nahar Bela" proposed to pass through the block. The construction of canal through the block is going to fragment this block further and about **50% of the available mineable limestone** reserve is going to be blocked. The fragmentation of the block will lead to unscientific, unviable and multi pit design planning to be adopted for the extraction of limestone which leads to unjustifiable environmental and economical strain for the organization.

Therefore, we request your good self to kindly direct the concerned office to expedite the requisite action for resolution of the issue by making out the diversion of the proposed "Bahuti Nahar Bela" canal away from the Badarkha Mining Lease area and extend the essential support towards conservation and exploitation of valuable mineral resources with due enhancement to the state exchequer.

- 2) Proponents shall mandatorily get water flow meter calibrated from an authorized agency once in a year.
- 3) Construction of purpose-built observation wells (piezometers) for ground water level monitoring shall be mandatory as per Section 14 of Guidelines. Water level data shall be made available to CGWA through web portal. Detailed guidelines for construction of piezometers are given in Annexure-II of the guidelines.
- 4) Proponents shall monitor quality of ground water from the abstraction structure(s) once in a year. Water samples from bore wells/ tube wells/ dug wells shall be collected during April/May every year and analysed in NABL accredited laboratories for basic parameters (cations and anions), heavy metals, pesticides/ organic compounds etc. Water quality data shall be made available to CGWA through the web portal.
- 5) In case of mining projects, additional key wells shall be established in consultation with the Regional Director, CGWB for ground water level monitoring four (4) times a year (January, May, August and November) in core as well as buffer zones of the mine.
- 6) In case of mining project the firm shall submit water quality report of mine discharge/ seepage from Govt. approved/ NABL accredited lab.
- 7) The firm shall report compliance of the NOC conditions online in the website (www.cgwa-noc.gov.in) within one year from the date of issue of this NOC.
- 8) Industries abstracting ground water in excess of 100 m³/d shall undertake annual water audit through certified auditors and submit audit reports within three months of completion of the same to CGWA. All such industries shall be required to reduce their ground water use by at least 20% over the next three years through appropriate means.
- 9) Application for renewal can be submitted online from 90 days before the expiry of NOC. Ground water withdrawal, if any, after expiry of NOC shall be illegal & liable for legal action as per provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
